You must be hired and working as a Health Care Aide Uncertified or Home Care Attendant Uncertified to be eligible to enroll in the Program.

A total of 320 clinical hours with Shepherd's Care Foundation is required to complete the Program.

WANT TO EARN AS YOU LEARN?

Shepherd's Care Foundation is collaborating with NorQuest and Northern Lakes Colleges to provide the Health Care Aide Workplace Training Program ("Program") through our sites.

This is an "earn as you learn" approach which applies to those applicants who seek to become **certified** on the provincial Health Care Aide Directory and work as Health Care Aides or Home Care Attendants with Shepherd's Care.

To be eligible for the Program, applicants must live in and be eligible to work in Canada and must be able to balance studying and working.

The Program will start in Fall 2023. If you are hired, the Program is 12-months long and has a total of 6 online courses which you will take through either **NorQuest** or **Northern Lakes Colleges**.

The clinical placement part of the Program would occur while you work for Shepherd's Care Foundation. During the Program, our nurse tutors will be available onsite to assess and sign off your skills.

Class and labs are both part of the Program and your attendance at them is mandatory.

After you complete the Program you must pass a Provincial Exam.

NorQuest and Northern Lakes College Admission requirements:

To be admitted to the Program the Colleges require that you meet certain English language requirements. You can talk to our Education Department team members about whether you meet these requirements. For your information the requirements are as follows:

Language Arts – this requirement can be met with any of the following, or an equivalent course:

- 60% in English Language Arts 20-2
- 55% in English Language Arts 30-2

If English is your second language, you must provide proof of English language proficiency ("ELP") before admission into the Program. These results must be no more than two years old when you start your Program. If you do not have proof of ELP, please start working on it as soon as possible. We find the Duolingo is flexible and fast.

Shepherd's Care Foundation Requirements:

To be hired by Shepherd's Care Foundation you need a clear Vulnerable Criminal Records Check and up to date immunizations.
